

*"Net Surplus" results for YTD 2023 may be overstated at times due to the timing of receipt and payment of certain invoices as average monthly expenses are flat-line budgeted at ~\$165,000. Additionally, unbudgeted first year receipts from Diocesan Faith, Hope, and Love Legacy Campaign (\$89,831.00) that were received in 9/2022 are included in the "Business Maintenance & Repair Receipts" (BMAR) line item. The parish share of Diocesan FHL Legacy Campaign funds have been allocated to the BMAR Fund to assist in building cash reserves for future maintenance and repairs expense of parish facilities estimated at \$300,000 annually.

Recently, we've added display cabinets in the reconciliation chapel. There are brass reliquaries which are displaying some of the relics of saints which the Cathedral has possessed for many years. The cabinet in the right of the window has a relic of Saint Robert Bellarmine (right) and Saint Clement Mary Hofbauer (left).

Cardinal Robert Bellarmine, S.J. was an Italian Jesuit and was named a Doctor of the Church, one of only 37. He was a professor of theology and taught at the University of Louvain. He is known for his writings and work during the Catholic Reformation or Counter-Reformation when the Protestant Reformation was attacking the church in the 16th century. He was appointed as personal theologian to Clement VIII. He also wrote two catechisms of Catholic doctrine which were used until the publication of the new catechism in the early 1990s. He is the patron saint of catechists because of his work in teaching the faith.

Clement Mary Hofbauer was a Moravian hermit and later became a Redemptorist priest. He established a congregation north of the Alps and worked to assist the poor. The political situation caused him to leave and he, along with his companions, went to Warsaw, Poland. From 1786 to 1808, Clement preached and built orphanages and schools. In his church, Clement and the community of five Redemptorist priests and three lay brothers began what they called the Perpetual Mission. Every day you could enter the church and hear five sermons both in German and Polish. Daily there were three High Masses, the Office of the Blessed Virgin Mary, public visits to the Blessed Sacrament, the Way of the Cross, Vespers, prayer services and litanies, along with confession being available all hours of the day and night. The Warsaw Uprising in 1794 caused all residents to be in constant danger. Three bombs crashed through the roof of the church during Holy Week in 1794 but did not explode. Hofbauer and companions continued to preach peace. There were protests against the Redemptorists and in 1808, they were taken to prison and then ordered to return to their own countries. Hofbauer returned to Vienna and worked as a hospital chaplain as well as having a small church. He became known as a great preacher and confessor.
