

The Cathedral will host the second blood drive for 2023 on Sunday, June 11th from 9:15am - 1:15pm in the Fleming Center. If you are interested in donating there are three ways to sign up.

Sign-ups can be done online. Simply follow the instructions below:

- 1. Go to www.redcrossblood.org.
- 2. Click on "Sign In" at the top of the page.
- 3. Sign in if you are a current donor or click on "Create an Account".
- 4. Enter "cathedral091" as the sponsor code.
- 5. Schedule your appointment.

You may sign up by phone, call Sally Stack @ 615-298-2932.We will also offer signups after all Masses in the Narthex on May 27th-28th and June 3rd-4th. If you are 17 years of age (16 with parental consent), weigh a minimum of 110 lbs and are in good general health you may be eligible to donate. This blood drive is the second of three drives the Cathedral will offer. Our third and final drive for 2023 will be October 8th.






considered "thorough Bishop Bvrne was а schoolman" and was determined that the Cathedral should have a school that would rank second to none. With this in mind, he purchased the property at 2009 to 2011 West End Avenue at the cost of \$200,000. That property is where the current Saint Albert Hall is located. On the west side of that property at 2015 and 2017 West End Ave., there were three buildings. They were stately homes that were later used as the school cafeteria, music classes and Cathedral High School for boys. The school for boys remained on the property until 1929 when Fr. Ryan High School opened on Elliston Place was built. In later years, those buildings were used for the Ladies of Charity, Cursillio, Saint Vincent de Paul Society, the Newman Club, Catholic Youth Organization and Catholic Youth. The

house known as the red brick building was demolished in 1979 and the Greystone building was demolished in 1989. Numerous members of the community protested the demolition because the homes were considered historic sites. The Cathedral and Monsignor Leo Siener prevailed noting that the Cathedral needed space for parking and the cost of renovating those buildings was too high.

In what is now at Saint Albert Hall, the Cathedral School was opened in September, 1909. At the opening, there was a newspaper article saying the school building was in a particularly quiet neighborhood and a large lot between the buildings would be afforded a commodious campus for recreation. The grammar school classrooms were on the second floor and the high school classrooms were on the third floor. At Bishop Byrne's insistence, the school was equipped with the latest and best labs, business education, high school commercial departments. The commercial school was co-ed and met in the evenings until the opening of Fr. Ryan High School. The commercial school was considered a school in practical and applied secretarial science.

Future Homeowner Wanda: Wanda says this is her second attempt at qualifying for the Habitat homeownership program. "Getting accepted into the program means the world." She says she is ready for the responsibility of taking care of her home and being responsible "for something that is mine." She is excited about meeting other future Habitat homeowners and building that sense of community as they work together toward homeownership.

"I am always helping other people. For one time in my life, I am finally helping me."
