





HELP OUR HAITI MISSION!

Haiti has made news recently as kidnappings and gang violence continue to be on the rise. The majority of the violence depicted in the media is in the capital city of Port-au-Prince, which is about a 3-4 hour drive from where our Twin Parish is located in La Vallée de Jacmel. The actual safety of the parishioners within our community is not impacted as greatly by the stories you see in the news. Yet, it has significantly affected the day-to-day life of all Haitians. The way the country of Haiti is set up is that everything comes through Port-au-Prince, so the insecurity in the capital has affected our community's ability to get basic supplies and travel about freely as done in the past. The most common occupations in our community are farmers, merchants and drivers. Each of these professions have been impacted by the inability to safely travel to and from Port-au-Prince to sell at markets, purchase supplies and transport travelers. Those that are still traveling in hopes of making a living risk their lives with each trip as there are frequent robberies, kidnappings and random violence along the route and especially within the city. Due to the dangers, many people have chosen not to travel, which has greatly impacted the economic situation in the country. These insecurities are creating a domino effect causing job loss, lack of resources, inability to receive and purchase goods, shutdown of businesses and institutions, rise in hunger, and so much more.

All of these problems have been felt by our mission, but here is a more specific look at what's going on in our community: Thankfully, our schools have been operating pretty much as normal. We had a successful school year and just graduated our class of 2023! Our high school students are currently participating in our English Summer Immersion Program as we are doing our best to keep operating as normal. Our college students have been impacted by the current situation because most universities are located in Port-au-Prince, making it difficult for teachers to get to work and for students to regularly attend classes due to safety concerns. Our chicken farm and bakery are able to operate, but have been greatly impacted by inflation, availability and cost of ingredients, inability to safely make deliveries, declining money in the hands of consumers, among other obstacles making it difficult to operate businesses. Our church is able to operate as usual and our Priest, Father Simon, has been hard at work making sure all the needs in the community are met.

While living amongst this violence and instability is disheartening for our parishioners, they have not lost hope. God's love and presence is still shining throughout our community and we know there are better days to come. We will not give up. We are creating the future leaders of Haiti and these obstacles will only make us stronger. Now is an even more important time than ever to support our Twin Parish in Haiti. Even though we cannot physically be present with them in Haiti, we are in regular communication with them and continuing to support our endeavors to change the country for the better.
