

In 1902, Bishop Thomas Sebastian Byrne purchased the property at the corner of 20th Ave. and West End Ave. with plans to build a new Cathedral for the Diocese of Nashville. In 1908, the rectory was completed and the Bishop moved in to supervise the construction of the new buildings. The Pro-Cathedral was finished in 1909 and the school opened with classrooms on the second and third floors with the chapel on the first floor.

In 1909, the building of the Cathedral of the Incarnation was begun. The architect was Fred Asmis from Nashville. The first part to rise above the ground was the bell tower, or campanile, which would be around 100 feet tall. The bell tower was designed similar to one built at Saint Damasus in Rome. The church was designed after the Basilica of San Martino ai Monte in Rome.

The inside dimensions of the church were 175 feet x 96 feet. The sanctuary was built to seat 1,000 people comfortably. Later, after two renovations, the altar area was enlarged and the sanctuary now seats about 800 people. There were three exquisitely carved marble altars modeled after altars at churches in Rome. The pews were made of solid oak in Jackson, Tennessee. They are the ones still currently used with the Celtic cross at the ends. The door and the five confessionals in the rear of the church were also made of fine oak.

There were 22 columns and 26 pilasters to support the roof. The ceiling was made of Scagliola, a fine plaster used for the first time in the United States. The stations of the cross were also made of Scagliolia.

There were 20 clerestory windows made of prismatic glass near the highest part of the roof. The lowest sections of the windows were opened and closed by turning a wheel in the choir loft. There were registers in the wooden floors that provided heat from underneath. There was also an electric vacuum system to help keep the building clean.

The lighting system was of magnificent brass chandeliers suspended from the ceiling with 350 lights, declared to be one of the largest and most efficient in the south.

The baptismal font was made in Italy and came from Saint Mary of the Seven Sorrows where it had been for ten years. It was a gift from Mr. and Mrs. Patrick Timothy, a wellknown Catholic family.

The Cathedral of the Incarnation was dedicated on July 26, 1914, the 20th anniversary of Bishop Byrne's Episcopal ordination. There were 1,000 people present with five bishops and many priests. Bishop Byrne was the main celebrant and Bishop Joseph Scrembs delivered the sermon. There was also a choir of 100 providing music accompanied by the beautiful sound of the new Pilcher organ.

In the coming weeks, and we hope before summer is out, you will notice some repairs being done on our roof. We've had a few spots that have "sprung a leak" because of all the rain we've had this summer, but hopefully we'll see those completed before Fall!


