



Blood Drive!

The Cathedral will host the third and final Blood Drive for 2023 on Sunday, October 22 in the Fleming Center from 9:15am–1:15pm. Signups are easy and can be done three ways. For online

signups go to www.redcrossblood.org, click on 'account login' at the top right hand side of the page and login in as a "donor", enter the sponsor code 'cathedral019' and then schedule your donation appointment time. By phone, call Sally Stack: (615)400-2932. We will have signups in person in the vestibule after all Masses on October 7/8 and 14/15. If you are 17 (16 with parental consent), weigh at least 110 pounds, and are in good general health you may be eligible to donate. This will be the third and last blood drive we host at Cathedral for 2023. The total units collected year to date is 65 units.

The Red Cross national blood supply has fallen by about 25% since early August as donor turnout dropped on the heels of one of the busiest travel seasons on record, back to school activities and an already active hurricane season. Blood product distributions to hospitals are outpacing the number of blood donations coming in, and the distributions of some of the most needed blood types to hospitals have been reduced in recent weeks. The Red Cross is working with hospitals around the clock to meet to blood needs of patients-but can't do it alone.








Cathedral Youth Group



Our beautiful Cathedral of today is quite different from when it was dedicated on July 26, 1914. There have been two major renovations, one in 1937 and the other in 1987.

The apse, the semicircular area where the crucifixion scene is, has had a major change. Originally there was a large stained glass window of the Annunciation on that wall. In 1937 that window was removed and became a part of the baptistery at Saint Henry Church.

The crucifixion scene and the altar beneath it were added in the 1937 renovation. The crucifixion scene and altar are made of Carrera marble from the Tomasi

Studios in Italy. It replaced the original scagliola altar which was a replica of the main altar of Saint Martin's church in Rome. Scagliola is a plaster like substance that is molded to look like marble.

The marble crucifixion scene includes figures of Mary, Mother of Jesus, Mary Magdalene, and John the Beloved. When it was installed in 1937, the total cost of the lifesize figures, the altar, the kneeling angels, and the tabernacle was \$6500. That altar is known as the altar of repose because the tabernacle is located there. Later on, to reflect the liturgical changes of the Second Vatican Council, there was a removable altar in the middle of the sanctuary. In 1987, that altar was replaced with an oak altar to match the new altar furniture as well as the kneeling Angels on the high altar going to the Saint Cecilia Motherhouse to reside in their cemetery. They were returned to their original place earlier this year.

There is a practice of placing relics of the Saints, usually martyrs, in the altars. It goes back to an ancient custom of honoring deceased heroes of the community. In ancient Rome, in the early years of Christianity, the Eucharist was celebrated on the grave sites of these martyrs on their anniversary. Later, church buildings were constructed on those sites. Since it is not possible to construct buildings on all of these sites, it became a custom to place relics in the altars of the churches built elsewhere. This is to venerate those who closely imitated the life of Jesus and to obtain intercessory prayers for the community. The original scagliola altar had the relic of Saint Thomas the Apostle, one of the patrons of the Bishop of Nashville, Thomas Sebastian Byrne. The relic in the altar of repose is of Pope Victor I, Bishop of Rome between 189 and 199 AD.

The current altar was installed in 2015. Inside, there is a box containing three first class relics and a second class relic, a piece of the habit worn by Saint Katherine Drexel, who founded the schools of the Diocese of Nashville. The first class relics inside the new altar include bone fragments of Saint Athanasius the Great, Benignus of Dijon, and Eulalia of Barcelona. These first class relics have been part of various alters at the Cathedral since 1909.


