



Information Concerning Advent 2023

This year, the First Sunday of Advent falls on Sunday, December 3rd and the Fourth Sunday of Advent falls on Sunday, December 24th. With the coming of Advent we begin a new liturgical season and soon our reading cycle will be Year B, the Gospel of St. Mark.

Because the Fourth Sunday of Advent falls on Christmas Eve this year, our Sunday Obligation tells us we must attend a Liturgy for that date (12/24) and a separate Liturgy to fulfill our Holy Day of Obligation for Christmas (12/25).

Masses for December 24th, the Fourth Sunday of Advent, will be:





PEANUT BUTTER BALLS



- 2 lbs peanut butter
- 2 sticks of melted butter
- 2 lbs powdered sugar
- 4 packages of chocolate almond bark

Combine the first three ingredients and mix by hand kneading into a dough-like texture. Roll by hand into small mouth sized balls ensuring the peanut butter mixture is tightly compressed.

In a double boiler or via microwave (a little at a time) heat the almond bark until smooth. Toss in the balls and fully cover and lay on aluminum foil to cool completely. Or the more traditional way is to use a toothpick and leave a circle exposed showing the peanut butter mixture this making a buckeye.

Note: this recipe makes A LOT of balls. I suggest calling a friend, family member, or neighbor and splitting the finished product in exchange for help making them. Also I suggest putting them in a candy tin and freezing them until the big day.

Olive Wood Hand Carvings

On the weekend of December 9th -10th Mary & Khader Abu Sada, a Catholic couple from the Holy Land, will be visiting our parish to market olive wood hand carved religious articles made by the Christian artisans in the Holy Land.

With the hostilities worsening in the Holy Land and due to the lack of Christian pilgrims, the outlets for the olive wood hand carvings have been closed, leading unemployment to increase up to 75% and forcing many Christians to leave the Holy Land in order to find other ways to market their handiwork. But the absence of a living Christian community is very disastrous for the Holy sites such as the Church of Nativity and the Church of the Holy Sepulcher.

This sale is to strengthen the Christian presence in the city of Bethlehem, the birthplace of Jesus, as well as the surrounding areas. All proceeds will go directly to the Christian families and the artisans who are working with this type of hand carvings.

They are going to display all kinds of olive wood religious art works such as: Nativity scenes, Crucifixes, figures, rosaries, etc. which are unique and not usually found in religious stores. These crafts make wonderful presents for all occasions especially for Christmas. Checks and credit cards are welcome.

The Elijah Cup Program Is Coming!

What is the Elijah Cup?

The Elijah Cup ministry has as its main focus to pray for an increase in priestly, diaconal, and religious vocations. Each week, a family, couple, or individual that has signed up will receive the Elijah Cup Chalice at Mass. For that week the



chalice remains with them as a focal point of prayer in their homes, dedicated specifically for an increase in vocations. At the end of the week the chalice is returned and is then handed over to the next person, couple, or family that signed up.

Why is it called the Elijah Cup?

The scriptural basis of the program is from the Old Testament reading of Elijah and the widow (Kings 1: 8-15) where God promises the widow that by providing food for Elijah of what little she had "the

jar of flour shall not go empty, nor the jug of oil run dry". At this command, the widow and her son were able to eat for a year without running out of food. Likewise through this program, by offering what we have we pray that God will provide and we will see an overflow of vocations in the parish, the deanery and the Diocese at large.


