

### Ash Wednesday and Lent: A Season of Reflection and Renewal

As we enter the liturgical season of Lent, we embark on a journey of spiritual reflection, penance, and preparation for the celebration of Easter. Ash Wednesday, which marks the beginning of Lent, holds deep significance for Christians worldwide. The following is a synopsis of the history, practices, and regulations associated with this solemn observance.

### 1. Ash Wednesday: Origins and Significance Origins

- The first Ash Wednesday ceremonies likely took place in the **11th** century CE. A verse in the Book of Daniel links fasting to ashes and might be the origin of this Lenten practice of receiving ashes at the start of the 40 days of Lent.
- In the early Christian church, the length of Lent varied, but eventually, it settled on 40 days (excluding Sundays) before Easter. Fasting and acts of penance are practiced to imitate Jesus' fast in the desert.

### Significance

- Ash Wednesday serves as a solemn reminder of human
- mortality and the need for reconciliation with God. On this day, ashes are applied in the shape of a cross on the foreheads of worshippers. The priest, deacon or lay minister will say "Remember that you are dust, and dust you shall return," to recall our mortality and

### call us to repentance from sin. 2. Practices and Regulations Ashes and Fasting

- In the modern Roman Catholic Church, ashes are obtained by burning the **palms** used on the previous **Palm Sunday**.
- Parishioners receive the ashes on their foreheads as a "memento **mori**", a reminder of our mortality and the need for spiritual renewal.
- Together with Good Friday, Ash Wednesday is an obligatory day of fasting and abstinence. On this day:
  - Catholics in good health ages 18 to 59 are required to fast and abstain from meat.
  - Fasting consists of eating only one meal, with smaller snacks that do not add up to a single full meal. Only one full meal is allowed.
    - Catholics age 14 and older should abstain from meat on all Fridays of Lent.

### Lenten Journey

- Lent extends over 40 days, mirroring Jesus' time in the wilderness.
- During Lent, we engage in practices such as prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.
- It is a time for **self-examination**, **repentance**, and **spiritual growth**.

As we receive the ashes on our foreheads, let us remember our mortality and turn our hearts toward God. Lent invites us to deepen our faith, seek forgiveness, and prepare for the joyous celebration of Easter. May this season be a time of transformation and renewal for each of us.

St. Valentine was jailed for his faith. One of his jailers had a daughter who was blind. After Valentine prayed with her, her sight was restored. This resulted in the jailer converting to the Christian faith. In 269 Valentine was sentenced to death. The last words of St. Valentine were in a note to the girl he had healed signing it "from your Valentine".

### Cursillo A Spiritual Resurrection **Mark Your Calendar!**



The Cathedral will host the first **Blood Drive** for 2024 on Sunday, March 3rd from 9:15-1:15 in the Fleming Center. Sign-ups are very easy and can be done three ways. For online sign ups go to www.redcrossblood.org and click on 'account login' at the top right hand side of the page and login as a "donor", enter the sponsor code 'cathedral019' and then schedule your donation appointment time. By phone call Sally Stack at (615) 400-2932. We will have in person sign-ups after all Masses on Feb 17/18 and Feb 24/25 in the Cathedral Narthex. If you are 17 (16 with parental consent), weigh at least 110 lbs and are in good general health, you may be eligible to donate. This is the first of three blood drives the Cathedral with host in 2024.

The American Red Cross continues to experience an emergency blood shortage as severe winter weather has impacted the ability to rebuild the blood supply. Since the beginning of the year, blood drives have been cancelled in nearly every state where the Red Cross collects blood, causing thousands of of potential donations to go uncollected. The Red Cross must collect an additional 8,000 blood donations each week over the next few weeks to recover from the current blood shortage. WE CAN HELP! PLEASE CONSIDER DONATING ON MARCH 3rd. 




