Dear Members:



Just a Reminder....

as it is coming up in a couple of weeks!



This year on February 14th (yes, Valentine's Day!), Ash Wednesday opens Lent, a season of fasting and prayer and takes place 46 days before Easter Sunday. Ash Wednesday comes from the ancient Jewish tradition of penance and fasting. The practice includes the wearing of ashes on the head. The ashes symbolize the dust from which God made us. As the priest applies the ashes to a person's forehead, he speaks the words: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return. Ashes also symbolize grief, in this case, grief that we have sinned and caused division from God. Writings from the second-century Church refer to the wearing of ashes as a sign of penance. Priests administer ashes during Mass and all are invited to accept the ashes as a visible symbol of penance. The ashes are made from blessed palm branches, taken from the previous year's Palm Sunday Mass.

It is important to remember that Ash Wednesday is a day of penitential prayer and fasting. Feasting is highly inappropriate. Small children, the elderly and sick are exempt from this observance.

It is not required that a person wear the ashes for the rest of the day, and they may be washed off after Mass. However, many people keep the ashes as a reminder until the evening. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the Season of Lent. It is a season of penance, reflection, and fasting which prepares us for Christ's Resurrection on Easter Sunday, through which we attain redemption.

Masses will be our normal daily Mass schedule at 7am, 12:10pm and 5:30pm.



Society of St. Vincent de Paul at the Cathedral

The Cathedral parish, with support from Father Eric, is evaluating whether to start an SVDP Conference that would aid our area poor and needy, as well as our parishioners that have temporary financial challenges, through our resources and collaboration with other agencies.

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul (SVDP) is the largest lay Catholic charity organization in the world located in 150+ countries, with over 700,000 members actively serving the poor in their local communities. In the US there are approximately 3,700 local Conferences with more than 65,000 active members helping the poor and needy. The purpose of Vincentian spirituality is for the average Catholic in the pew to grow in holiness by personally helping those in need. The main focus of SVDP is not about the poor, but about Catholics. It is about Catholics helping the poor, and growing in holiness by doing so.

There are currently 10 SVDP Conferences in our diocese: St. Christopher (Dickson), Our Lady of the Lake (Hendersonville), St. Henry (Nashville), St. John Vianney (Gallatin), St. Matthew (Franklin), St. Patrick (McEwen), Immaculate Conception (Clarksville), St. Edward (Nashville), Sacred Heart (Lawrenceburg), and St. Ann (Nashville). The 11th Conference at Holy Rosary (Donelson) is in process. Cathedral would be the 12th Conference.

If you are interested in learning more about SVDP and are seeking to enhance your spiritual formation, please join us on February 18, 2024 in the Fleming Center from 9:45 -10:45 AM.
